



Frequently Asked Questions

Fall Day Camp 2017

Q: What is the schedule for the day?

A: For the Morning Session, check-in begins at 8:30 a.m. and the program will begin at 9:00 a.m. Activities will end at noon. For the afternoon session, check-in begins at 1:00 p.m. and the program will begin at 1:30 a.m. Activities will end at 4:30 p.m.

Q: Who can attend?

A: Cub Scouts of any rank, parents, siblings, and friends.

Q: What do we need to bring?

A: Please bring a water bottle, closed-toed shoes (mandatory at camp), warm layers (we will be outside most of the day), rain gear (just in case), and part A & B of the [BSA Medical Form](#) and the [Minnesota Shooting Sports Waiver](#).

Q: Can the Scout's younger sibling participate with them, if they're under 5?

A: Campers under 5 will be able to participate in all activities except Archery and BB Guns.

Q: I have two Scouts in different grades, will they be together or split up?

A: Bear and Webelos scouts (3rd and 4th grade) will spend the first two hours of camp doing the outpost program. The outpost takes place away from the rest of the campers. If you have a cub scout in 3rd or 4th grade and one in a younger grade, we ask that a second parent or trusted adult attend the outpost.

Q: What is the older scout outpost?

A: This is a new activity designed specifically for Bears and Webelos. These scouts will spend the first two hours of camp doing a variety of structured activities and games.

Q: Can siblings and friends attend Fall Day Camp?

A: Yes! We will have fun activities for the entire family and non-scout friends.

Q: Are there Overnight Fall Opportunities?

A: Yes! The Spooky-Ree is a two night Cub Scout camporee at Stearns Scout Camp. Family friendly activities will have a Halloween theme. Learn more and register at www.nsbsa.org/cubcamp.

Q: Can we register as a family or do we need to register with the Pack?

A: Yes, you can register as an individual however we encourage Packs to register together to help streamline the check-in process.
